Mississippi Science Fest Celebrates STEM the Third Weekend in September

Jackson, Miss. – The Mississippi Science Festival (MSF) is the LeFleur Museum District's (LMD) signature event presented by C Spire, which will take place on **September 16-18, 2021**.

MSF brings the community together to celebrate careers in STEM (science, technology, engineering, and math) and has introduced children of all ages to the wide variety of STEM concepts and industries that are available in Mississippi. Guests can purchase 1 ticket for Saturday's festival and explore all 4 museums for one low ticket price of \$10. Exhibitors and activities will be at all four LMD museums – the Mississippi Sports Hall of Fame and Museum, the Mississippi Agriculture & Forestry Museum, the Mississippi Children's Museum, and the MDWFP's Mississippi Museum of Natural Science.

For this year's MS Science Fest, we are excited to welcome American scientist and activist, Temple Grandin, to speak about her experience with science and agriculture. Grandin will speak at the MS Agriculture Museum, Friday, September 17 at 11:00 a.m. and will speak at the Mississippi Children's Museum, Saturday, Sept. 18 at 11:00 a.m.

This year, there will be multiple events taking place over the course of three days:

On this special day, visitors can purchase a \$10 ticket allowing them to visit and participate in MSF festivities at all four LMD museums. A free shuttle will be provided between museums and food vendors will be onsite throughout the day at all museums.
